



ABSTRACT

IMPACT OF REGIONAL MINIMUM WAGE, AGRICULTURE PRODUCTIVITY AND PADDY PRICE ON AVERAGE WAGE OF FARMER LABOR IN WEST JAVA 1981-2000

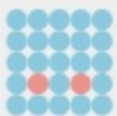

The purpose of this study was to analysis an impact of a regional minimum wage, agriculture productivity and paddy price on average wage of farmer labor. The tools used were multiple regression whereas regional minimum wage, agriculture productivity and rice price as an independent variables and average wage of farmer labor as a dependent variable.

The policy of regional minimum wage is only benefit for those who work in a coverage sector and harm for those who work in an uncoverage sector. The study also suggested that the policy of regional minimum wage should meet to an original purpose as a safety net; It is not necessary to review annually; It is necessary to empower an internal beparty institution to set a minimum and average wage within each a company; and the prime role of government as a regulator is how to make a balances between policy as tool to improve labor welfare and to create employment as much as possible.

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
